Help protect OUr Kauri forests

A disease has been identified in this region which is threatening the health of kauri trees.

This disease can kill kauri of all sizes, and symptoms include yellowing leaves, canopy thinning, dead branches and eventually the death of the tree. Affected trees can also develop large lesions that bleed resin.

The disease is spread mainly through soil movement, including on running shoes, tramping boots, mountain bikes and equipment.

What **YOU** can do to help

Keep to the defined tracks in parks Clean and remove soil from your shoes and equipment before and after entering kauri forest areas

Stay away from kauri tree roots as much as possible
