

Trees put forward for consideration of protection in the Waitakere City Council District Plan

1. Pohutukawa, sequence, both sides Beach Valley Road, from 6/30 Beach Valley Road to 37/62 Beach Valley Road, in road reserves and private land, remnants of original coastal pohutukawa forest - landscape, heritage, amenity and ecological.

2. Pohutukawa, sequence, Sylvan Glade, road reserves and private land, original coastal pohutukawa forest – landscape, amenity and ecological.

3. Pohutukawa, sequence, Garden Road in entirety, including Claude Abel Reserve. Garden Road has been on the CHI inventory since December 1993 when it was requested by Waitakere City Council. It is number Q11 (Grid Reference NZMS 260 Map Sheet) where it is described as “Narrow sealed road, treelined, houses set back behind mature trees, good gardens, residential, lily pond adds special character to street” - landscape, heritage, amenity and ecological.
4. Pohutukawa, sequence in old backdunes, west side of Garden Road, between 72 and 88 Garden Road. The owners of 76-80 Garden Road, Susan Davis and Gregor Nicholas, have agreed to have their pohutukawa included - landscape, heritage, amenity and ecological.

5. Pohutukawa, single specimen, 57 Garden Road, particularly large specimen. Owner of the property, Melanie Reid, has asked that it be included in the schedules - amenity, botanical, and ecological.

6. Pohutukawa, single specimen, in road reserve in front of 10 Garden Road, particularly fine tree with upright habit – landscape and amenity.

7. Pohutukawa, sequence in old backdunes, Marine Parade North, east side fronting road, from 139-165 Marine Parade North – landscape, amenity and ecological. At risk of being cut/removed for views and entrances.

8. Pohutukawa, single specimen, in road reserve on seaward side of North Piha Road, on bank of Marawhara Stream – landscape and amenity.

9. Pohutukawa, sequence in old backdunes, east side of North Piha Road, from 1-13 North Piha Road – landscape, amenity and ecological.

10. Pohutukawa, two specimens joining over road, on road reserve outside 14 and 27 North Piha Road – landscape and amenity.

11. Pohutukawa, single specimen, road reserve and Domain beside Piha Library, visible in old photos – heritage and amenity.

12. Pohutukawa, planted sequence on perimeter of Domain from Piha Stream bridge to Domain toilet block, and specimens on road reserve, some planted by Piha Ratepayers' Association as a WW2 memorial – landscape, heritage and amenity .

13. Pohutukawa, grove, 63 Sea View Rd – notable in landscape in 1920s photos. Owners of property, Kath Dewar and Tony Dunn, have given permission for these trees to be scheduled – landscape, heritage and amenity.
14. Pohutukawa, single specimen, on road reserve and 94 Seaview Road, below Rayner Rd – landscape and amenity.
15. Pohutukawa, single specimen, on road reserve and 91 Seaview Road, below Rayner Road – landscape and amenity.

16. Pohutukawa, sequence, 16-18 Seaview Road, Surf Rider Country Club site – landscape, heritage and amenity.
17. Pohutukawa, sequence and single specimen, 36 Seaview Road. The single specimen is a landmark on site of former Piha Hall and Picture Theatre – heritage and amenity.

- 18 Puriri, single specimen, 64 Glen Esk Road, Stedfast Park, visible in many photos of Piha Mill, trees blown over in storm, now regrowing with epiphytes – botanical, heritage and ecological

- 19 Pohutukawa, single, but part of group, outside 1 Marine Parade South. This fine pohutukawa appears to be within the regional parkland, but it is vulnerable because of its proximity to the road, private property and to the gate to the boat ramp – amenity.



The pohutukawa is the one to the right of the boatshed.

20 Pohutukawa above Pendrell Road. This is one of the most beautiful and prolific flowerer of trees at Piha. It is a great landmark but hard to photograph. It is not clear whether it is in the regional parkland or in 1 Pendrell Road or 2 Piha Road – landscape, amenity and ecological.
